Fish Passage In North Fork Johnson Creek—A Six-Year Journey


In 2015, we identified North Fork Johnson Creek as a cold water tributary that was blocked for spawning salmonids by seven partial or complete fish passage barriers.

The Council partnered with many agencies to address all seven. East Multhomah Soil & Water Conservation District removed or replaced three culverts on their Headwaters Farm.

JCWC replaced or retrofitted four culverts, the final one under SE 267th Street in 2021.

In this project, pictured here, we installed the low-cost Flexi-baffles, a technology we pioneered on another North Fork culvert in 2018, the first such installation in the Western United States.





Barrier #4 In The Kelley/Mitchell System: Check!



JCWC restored fish passage at a fourth location in 2021. A concrete footbridge crumbled and fell into Mitchell Creek downstream from Baxter Road years ago. We removed this debris, creating a clear path for salmonids.


In 2019 and 2020, we removed two culverts and one dam in this system, providing more cold water access for salmon and steelhead, providing a refuge from the impacts of climate change.


Before (left) and after (right) photos on Mitchell Creek of the concrete fish passage barrier.



After fixing fish passage barriers--removing or replacing dams and culverts--we need to ask, "Do the fish indeed swim upstream of the old barrier?" Traditional techniques such as visual surveys for salmon redds or post-spawned carcasses can miss a lot, especially because spawning season occurs during higher water when visibility is low. Electrofishing can be expensive and harm fish.

In the past two years, the Council has begun using environmental DNA testing. We run stream water through a special filter and send the filter to a lab. If we find DNA from the target species, we know it's above the old barrier. It is easy to miss DNA, so we sample at the same location over multiple years.


